TGSA'S POLICIES AND PRACTICES MUST REFLECT OUR COMMITMENT TO EQUALITY. MEMBERS AND ELECTED OFFICERS MUST BE MINDFUL THAT ALL GRADUATE STUDENTS DESERVE DIGNITY, EQUALITY, AND RESPECT.

Last year was busy for the TGSA with by-law rewriting, Board restructuring, and revitalizing the Association's relationship with Trent administration. This year we focused on maintaining positive relationships throughout the University and Peterborough community and advocating for graduate student needs.

Completed tasks for 2023-2024:

- Negotiated the allocation of graduate-student-only space in the new residence buildings (September 2028)
- Regular meetings with Senior Administration to discuss current issues facing graduate students
- Restructuring TGSA bursaries to provide more funds for graduate students (~\$40,000 between TGSA Financial Support and TGSA Academic Development Bursaries)
- Created a TGSA Endowment to provide additional funds for the operating budget
- Helped coordinate the implementation of in-person Health & Safety talks during Orientation week with a lab safety component
- Complied information for WeDesign to develop a TGSA website that is informative and useful for graduate students
- Information tree for student resources and helpful contact information
- Negotiated with Miranda Studios to provide free photos for every graduate student who walked across the start at convocation
- Represented the TGSA on: Colleges and Student Services Committee (CASSC), Athletics Advisory Committee, Convocation Committee, Graduate Studies Committee (GSC), Research Policy Committee (RPC), and other associated awards committees and sub-committees

VP, STUDENT AFFAIRS-SARAH RAYNER

As VP, Student Affairs this year I have been in communication with graduate students in a supportive role, helping with housing and academic issues. I have also planned and followed through with monthly events, and have offered support in others, including:

VP, SENATE---WILLIAM KIM

- Involved with selecting the new Trent President
- Involved in research grants at Trent University
- Involved in undergraduate and graduate course development committees

VP, INTERNAL AFFAIRS-**DANIEL PALBERG**

- Developed endowment alongside the TGSA President and Financial Advisor. Approximately \$160,000 will be placed into an endowment, from which the interest earned will be added to the annual operating budget. This brings additional operating funds while aligning with by-law conditions.
- Switch from TD Bank to Kawartha Credit Union (KCU) to reduce fees associated with account maintenance and routine transactions.
- Designed and implemented the International Student Affairs Committee (ISAC) terms of reference in alignment with the TGSA by-laws and policies.
- Collaborated with Trent Graduate Finance and the School of Graduate Studies (SGS) to roll out the Academic Development Bursary, including recommendations for per-student allocation, eligibility requirements, and conditions of use.
- Consulted with website designers and awarded contract to WeDesign after formal RFP process. Worked intimately with web engineers to redesign the TGSA website.
- Alongside TGSA executive, orchestrated the discontinuation of formal audits, while adhering to provincial and federal laws and guidelines for not-for-profit organizations. Regular financial statements will continue to be cross-checked and issued by the TGSA. Dispensing with formal financial audits will increase the operating budget by approximately 10%.
- Represented the membership as the graduate student representative on the Science Safety Committee, Trent Student Charter Review Committee, Trent Sexual Violence Policy Committee, Graduate Studies Committee.
